We are looking for 1-2 responsible, highly organized individuals to join our team of On-Farm Educators with Angelic Organics Learning Center. On-Farm Educators facilitate educational programs at the Learning Center for children and adults on a seasonal, part-time basis. Ideal candidates will have experience with organic farming, environmental education, and working with diverse audiences.

Angelic Organics farm serves as our outdoor classroom, including vegetable fields, cover crop fields, pasture, livestock, wild spaces, and orchard. Our programs are experiential, and strive to engage mind, body and heart in the life of the farm. We seek to honor the knowledge and experience of all of our program participants, and to encourage personal reflection and positive actions.

Most programs include a whole farm tour, which is an experiential introduction to the farm emphasizing how soils, animals, plants and people interact on an organic farm. Longer programs may incorporate work projects, nutrition and cooking, food systems literacy, and workshops on organic gardening, sustainable agriculture, or livestock care.

Our age groups range from preschool to adult. Programs may include school groups, community groups, individuals, families, birthday parties and day camps. This position is seasonal and part-time, with scheduling done on an as-needed basis. Programs typically range from 2 to 6 hours, with periodic overnights requiring camping with groups. We anticipate approximately 6-15 days total of programming per educator in 2010, with the possibility to increase hours in future.

Essential Responsibilities

On-farm educators will facilitate education programs for groups of children, youth and adults from diverse backgrounds. This includes:

- ➤ Attending to safety of participants, and the care and respect of farm

- animals, plants, and the land.
- Assisting with preparation and clean-up of materials, tools, program spaces, bathrooms and grounds.
- Working cooperatively with team of educators to plan, prepare, implement and reflect on programs.
- Working with youth assistants, who will help with programs periodically.
