JOB DESCRIPTION

We are looking for an enthusiastic and well-organized Farm Manager to lead, teach, and inspire, our 8-10 person Portland based farm crew by working actively alongside them through all day-to-day operations at the farm. The Farm Manager will work with Laura (farm owner) to create a flexible plan for the week, then work with the crew to make that plan a reality. Experience managing all aspects of organic vegetable production and motivating a diverse crew doing hard physical labor are both extremely important skills for the job.

The 47th Avenue Farm is a close-knit community of farm workers, CSA members, and occasional volunteers. Farm Manager must be willing and able to work hard and communicate effectively, in order to help the farm and our diverse crew reach their full potential. Attention to detail is also important, as the Farm Manager will supervise all of the record

keeping on the farm. And good sense of humor definitely comes in handy too! Also on our wish list of skills that the ideal Farm Manager would bring to the job is fluency in Spanish and familiarity with Mac, Excel, and Filemaker Pro.

Much of the work on our farm is done by hand. This requires physical strength and stamina. During the summer the Farm Manager can expect a 50-hour work week including monthly Saturday work parties, and occasional field trips. Winter hours are less.

The farm is a fertile learning ground for those who are willing to work hard. If you are a person with tremendous energy and enthusiasm for farming and for managing people and if you have the experience we're looking for, please fill out our application form and send it to us with your resume and three references.

ABOUT THE FARM

The 47th Avenue Farm is a unique urban farm started 15 years ago by Laura Masterson. Our CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) project began on a double lot within the city limits. We now grow vegetables year round on 14 acres of land within the Portland Metro Area and we're bringing another 15-20 acres on Grand Island into production over the next few years. The CSA is our main endeavor, but we also serve local restaurants as well.

The farm crew meets every morning at Laura's house, 6632 SE 47th Ave, to carpool to the other farm sites. Our Tuesday CSA pickup takes place too. Our Thursday CSA pickup and the majority of our urban farming operation happens at Luscher Farm, 125 Rosemont, West Linn. The Portland-based farm crew will occasionally carpool down to Grand Island during the course of the season.
